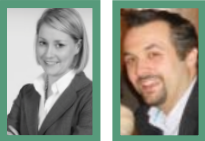

## You're Invited to the 2014 Bowring Park Centennial!



Michael Power, Chairman of the Bowring Park Foundation, wants you to know that 2014 will be a special year at Bowring Park. It will be the park's 100th birthday and the Foundation, along with the City of St. John's, is planning events to celebrate throughout the year. According to Mr. Power, "The Centennial will be special not only for those people who have enjoyed Bowring Park for years but also for new visitors as it will give them opportunities to experience and enjoy what the park has to offer".



According to Nick Janes and Ashley Power-Stack, the co-chairs of the Centennial Committee, "There will be something for everyone! We want people to come and enjoy their park". Some of the events being planned include a public Easter Egg Hunt, storytelling sessions throughout the summer, winter fun days, and teas for seniors.

"One of the major events being planned that we are really excited about is a re-enactment of Bowring Park's official opening which occurred on July 15, 1914. The Bowring Park Foundation has been fortunate to receive some black and white silent film footage of the actual event from NTV so that will certainly assist in the planning for the re-enactment" Nick informed us.

Ashley continued, "As well, the Foundation has been in contact with one of the attendees at the event in 1914. Although just a baby at the time, 99 year old Victoria LeMessieur-Badcock, has memories of her mother telling her about the event and showing her photos. Indeed, Victoria is a great source of information as she spent most of her childhood summers in the park. Visitors to the Centennial events may get an opportunity to meet Victoria as she has already told us she is planning to attend as many events as possible".



According to Nick and Ashley, you will hear much more about Bowring Park's Centennial in the upcoming months from both the Bowring Park Foundation and the City of St. John's. There are plans for some promotional events during the fall so stay tuned.

# SWANS

## — did you know that...

- ★ swans were first introduced to Bowring Park on July 1, 1946 and that these six swans were donated to the City of St. John's by His Majesty, King George VI?
- ★ males are called "cobs", females are called "pens" and babies are called "cygnets"?
- ★ cobs are usually larger than the pens?
- ★ cobs have a brighter bill and a longer knob at the base of the bill than the pens?
- ★ a group of swans is called a "herd"?
- ★ swans are vegetarians that prefer to graze on grass and plants at the water's edge?
- ★ bread is not good for the swans as it dehydrates them and fouls their water habitat?
- ★ swans are extremely territorial and will drive all birds from the immediate area?
- ★ the Bowring Park Duck Pond is only large enough to support one mating pair of swans?
- ★ swans can often live for 30 years or more?

## A ROMANTIC STORY ABOUT THE BIRDS IN BOWRING PARK

About five years ago, a goose lived in the Duck Pond in Bowring Park. Regular visitors there called the white and grey Snow Goose in the photo below "Goosie" and they gave the name "Fanny" to his duck companion. It was a common sight to see Goosie with Fanny and her ducklings. The story goes that Goosie was very protective of Fanny and the "little ones" so when a male swan caused them trouble, Goosie got on the swan's back and drove the swan away. Goosie passed on June 7th, 2008, but he is still remembered fondly by his human friends.

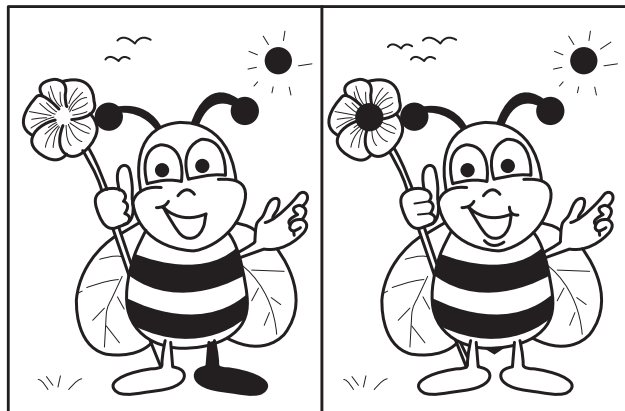
## HOW TO MAKE YOUR OWN BIRD FEEDER

**Supplies:** • Large open pine cone • Vegetable shortening, lard, suet • Oats or Corn meal  
• Bird seed • Few feet of string.

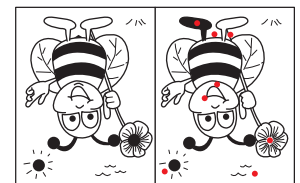
**Instructions:** • Tie the string to the pine cone • Cover the pine cone with food mixture • Then roll the pine cone in birdseed • Then it's all ready to hang outside!

**Food Mixture:** • Mix ½ cup vegetable shortening with 2 ½ cups corn meal or uncooked oats until well blended. **Optional:** add dried chopped fruit, or chopped nuts and seeds.
