This is the sixth year for the Peter Pan Festival and crowds continue to grow. Highlights included soap-box derby car races, the Great Big Car Show and live performers entertaining at the Cabot 500 Amphitheatre. The event was sponsored by the Bowring Park Foundation in cooperation with the City of St. John's.


Did You Know?

We also spent a lot of time playing tennis. It was very popular with all of my buddies at the time. When I got a little older we would walk to Bowring Park and save the ten cents, it was a lot of money in those days. "

John Murphy, former mayor of St. John's, reflecting on Bowring Park remembered fondly bright sunny days when he and his two sisters would go to the Park with his parents and enjoy a family picnic near the tennis courts. The

have always loved two things about the Park, the rivers and the flowers. The river on the north side of the Park, with its many brooks, waterfalls and great looking bridges, was a wonderful place to walk. I have always been a lover of flowers. Years ago I knew the Stanley family from Kilbride quite well. They planted most of the flowers in the Park in those days and I spent hours talking with them about that". Another of John's favorite activities was to row one of the boats around the Duck Pond. "We would always have a full day at Bowring Park,

About The Foundation

The Bowring Park Foundation was established in 1995, as envisioned by Derrick Bowring, Honorary Patron of the Bowring Park Foundation, and living descendent of Benjamin Bowring, to undertake the restoration and further development of Bowring Park in St. John's. The scope of this vast undertaking will involve many and varied projects in the west section, as well as a major restoration and enhancement of the original 50 acre park.

Already the Foundation has completed a new steel arched bridge over Captain's Falls, and a major restoration of the Conservatory that is opened to the public. We have added two new accessible play structures to the playground and installed 20,000 sq ft. of hard pack around the site. The Foundation, working in cooperation with the City of St. John's, the Grand Concourse Authority and ACOA, have completed a major restoration of the Duck Pond. The Foundation is recognized by Revenue Canada as a charitable organization (registration number 89826 7471 RP0001). Donations are gratefully received at the Foundation office.
